Mind and Flesh: Connecting Linguistic Knowledge to Neurons

Abstract

I present the major gap between linguistic representations in the mind, and neurophysiological representations of language in the brain, and show how Embodiment Theory attempts to bridge this gap. I will show previous findings about the representation of the lexical and semantic aspects of language. However, much linguistic information is structural rather than lexical. I present our model of how prosody can be the 'action-perception' that is embodied, and how it transforms linguistic information into 'brain language'. I present data from some recent experiments in our lab that support this model.
